Congratulations to the overworked and understaffed teams who put on both the road rally and the stage rally each year, these are truly mammoth tasks, which are usually performed by the same faces each time. I fully appreciate the work required, (having had plenty of experience), and would appeal to all members/readers of this article to offer any assistance and support they can, not necessarily to be involved in the organisation, (although this would be greatly appreciated), but simply to help on the day of the events. The club needs these events to keep the club treasurer happy, to develop the clubhouse, to finance the next big event etc. Thanks to the few.

Yup agreed, thanks to the few and new helpers are always welcome.

So what's new? - we have been appealing for help for years and we still get by - yes, but how? A good example of how was on the recent Trackrod Forest Stages Rally when the Club took full responsibility for one of only 8 stages forming this prestige event, the one at Staindale. Run as it was at a very civilised time of the day, I was unpleasantly surprised at the lack of support from the club's members, having hardly sufficient bodies to cover the stage timing, stage marshalling was virtually non-existent.

We only survived the event by coercing sufficient 86Mhz radio operators to adequately cover the stage, people who were really spectating on our early stage before going to operate on later stages,

Our thanks go to Hallam5, Rip1, Eagle9, Humber6 and Arc3, none of which were expecting to help on Staindale and all of which were essential to the safe running of the stage.

I think it was a particularly bad day in that several other events were scheduled locally on the same day and Saturdays do seem to be badly attended as a lot more people than past years seem to have to work, or want to work for the extra money?

I look forward to reading the newsletter but often get frustrated reading event reports which leave you guessing who wrote them, everyone's name gets a mention except the author!

I do sometimes omit to mention who the author of a piece is, Colin, but generally I am as you once were the author of the newsletter rather than the Editor. I did a count up when looking at who was going to get the Colin Barnes Newsletter award and only six reports had been penned by other club members over the last club year.

It is disturbing to find so many club night activities advertised which don't take place. Is this due to lack of bodies again?

Yes lack of bodies, I have a tabletop which has been ready to put on since about 12 months ago but when only one or two people want to have a go it hardly seems worth putting it on.

The situation in the club championships has not been published since May. I presume this is a result of club event organisers not providing the necessary details of entrants etc. for points to be allocated. Such details should always appear in the newsletter but I can't remember reading any for some considerable time.

John Roberts was rather short of time this year to do the Championships so I have got them together with my Computer but the information that has come in is rather sparse and the championship tables attached to the newsletter reflect this.

The club appears to lack promoting itself, here's a few examples:

1) I didn't see the club banner on the Staindale stage, a good place to advertise - free, or is it still missing, (see April newsletter).

It is still missing and when **Pete Gunson** who has had it in his Garage for at least a year now brings it back we will be most grateful. If he doesn't bring it back soon we shall send him a bill for a new one!

- 2) I recently read the September issue of Rally Sport magazine and can't find Selby & DMC in the Club Corner Club Directory, is this a mistake or an oversight or don't we bother to tell them we exist?
- 3) I have just received the York area Citizens Guide for 1998 which includes the Ryedale, Harrogate, Malton, York and Selby areas. In it I find York Motor Club, Malton Motor Club, even the Jowett Owners Club amongst others, yet nothing about Selby and DMC! We have just as much and more to offer as other clubs, why not publicise the fact?

We have been appealing for some time now for a person to contact the local and national media and to bang our drum. Obviously as you have pointed out we are missing out, on valuable free publicity which wouldn't take a great deal of time to obtain, any volunteers (your phone calls and stamps would be paid for).

One last bouquet - I will pay my subs which are now due.



#### 1. CLUB PERSON OF THE YEAR.

#### 2. COMPETITOR OF THE YEAR.

Males for the A. D. Clare Award and females for the S. R. Whitaker award. Points for this award are scored on all events held within and organised by Selby and District Motor Club on the following basis:

Points scored for starting any event.

3

Points for a placing in the final results 10 points to the highest placed finisher and pro rata downwards depending on the number of finishers. E.g. If 7 members finished an event each will receive 3 points for starting plus (10/7) x 7 for the winner and (10/7) x 6 for the second etc.....

#### 3. BEST NEWCOMER FOR THE GRAHAM DEIGHTON AWARD.

Eligible members are those in their FIRST FULL YEAR OF CLUB MEMBERSHIP, the award going to the member gaining the highest number of points obtained by adding together their points in the Club person and the Competitors championships. The championship points collator will keep available a list of members eligible for the award.

#### 4. THE M. G. MORGAN SHIELD.

This award is presented to the member scoring the most Best Selby entrant finishes, (irrespective of the number of Selby entrants), in Rallies organised by clubs other than Selby & DMC. Claims are subject to the same requirements as the Best Selby Awards (see below) except there is no minimum entrant requirements.

#### 5. TABLETOP RALLY CHAMPIONSHIP FOR THE SILVER HERRINGBONE AWARD.

During each club year, a series of eight Tabletop rallies will be held, the member scoring the most points will receive the award. The points will be taken from the best six results from the eight events. Points are scored on the same basis as the competitor of the year.

#### 6. MARSHALLING AWARD.

This award is to encourage members to assist other clubs with the running of their events by time keeping, marshalling and radio operation. Points are scored as in the Club Person Championship items marked \*\*.

#### 7. BEST NEWSLETTER ARTICLE FOR THE COLIN BARNES AWARD.

This award will be presented to the member who has submitted the best article for publication in the Club Newsletter during the club year. The Newsletter Editor for the year will decide which article, in his opinion, was the best.

#### 8. OLD BOOT.

This will be presented at the discretion of the Club Chairman for the Club year and will generally be presented to a member who has done much hard work for the benefit of the club but who has received little in recognition of his/her efforts.

#### 9. LARKSPEED LEAGUE AWARDS.

Depending on the performance of the club in the league, cash awards are made to the club. To encourage members to compete in the league events for the club may make cash awards to the five highest scoring members during the current year. The cash sum divided between the five members will be dependent upon the cash sum won by the Club in the PREVIOUS year. In general, it will be half the sum won but will be a maximum of £100.00.

#### 10. BEST SELBY & DMC AWARDS.

To encourage members to enter events organised by other clubs, the club will give an award to the highest placed club entry (on any event) subject to the following:-

- a. There are a minimum of THREE club entries on any one event.
- b. If the event requires two persons to form the crew, BOTH crew members must be paid up members of Selby & DMC.
- c. The onus is on the Competitor to claim for an award (See 10a).
- d. All claims MUST be substantiated by an entry list and full results.
- e. Eligible events will include any form of in car competition.

#### 11. GENERAL.

#### A) SUBMISSION OF CLAIMS.

All claims MUST be submitted to the points collator within 4 weeks of the event to be included in the various championships.

#### B) DISPUTES.

Any disputes concerning either these rules or any individual's points must be submitted in writing to the club secretary for consideration by the club committee.

#### C) SPECIAL EVENTS.

Should the club committee decide that any particular event requires special attention they may decide to allocate the points differently to the above for such an event.

#### D) THE CLUB YEAR.

The club year begins on the first of October and finishes on the 30th September. All awards are related to the club year with the exception of the Larkspeed League which runs from January first each year.

#### E) PRESENTATION OF AWARDS.

With the exception of the Larkspeed League and the best Selby awards all awards are the property of Selby & DMC and will be presented at the annual presentation of Awards. Recipients of the trophies will keep them for a period of approximately one year. The trophies MUST be returned to the club after one year or earlier if called for by the club committee.
