# MEM Gravel Sprint by Malton Motor Club

Plenty of the club members got involved in this event which was a first for the area and below is one competitors thoughts.

# SUCCESS OR SHAMBLES?

The event was a milestone in British motorsport. Just like the super specials of the Race of Champions and the Rally of Australia were new concepts that might just catch on, the gravel sprint could be one avenue to branch out into for rallying.

Others have failed. The Clipstone rally sprint failed to attract the necessary entries to run the event in August. Another attempt in October fell on it's behind. But Malton managed to run an event so it's a big hats off to the organising crew for getting that far at least.

The Course

The service area or paddock was in the quarry in Dalby Forest. An ideal service area spoiled only by heavy and persistent rain for at least three months prior to the event. A three and a half mile anticlockwise circuit in Dalby calling at Derek Bell's Bend, the Woodyard and the twisty ascent of Flax Dale proved to be an excellent stage with the hairpin left uphill finish into the quarry.

Format

The idea was great! A convoy run to introduce the competitors to the course and eliminate the need to pacenote it. One timed practice to get used to the conditions and then in to the competition proper. Each competitor's fastest run of the day counts towards overall honours and a total of six attempts at the stage were offered. Value for money that's not bad. Twenty-five stage miles for eighty-five quid in the Yorkshire Forests Anita bad really.

#### Marshalling

Marshals were to have line of site coverage of the whole stage. A nightmare for both organisers who had to source the marshals, and the marshals themselves, who were to face a long, hard day possibly out in the cold, wind and rain and for most, be separated from their cars for the day. A red flag system was in operation to warn competitors of hazards they may be approaching like broken cars or scattered junctions etc. This system was to be the major stumbling block of the whole event albeit a necessary precaution.

### How Did It Go?

#### The question on everybody's lips!

Quite well actually. As the first event of its type that I know of there was always going to be a few mistakes. Time was a deciding factor and it was taking much longer than expected to get the sixty-five or so cars through each stage. Even when thirty second starts were adopted it was still a long and drawn out job. As a competitor it is easy to criticise but in my view the majority of delays were caused by over zealous marshalling. I personally made three attempts at a practice run being red flagged on my first two due to stalled cars. On each occasion, the cars in question had been re-started and were on their way again before the following car would have arrived. Perhaps the flags should only be used in emergencies and not waved for trivial reasons. Does the red flags could be deployed in the sectors preceding the incident only and the stage stopped only due to blockages as per a normal stage. Marshal's instructions and training evenings/days could be used to educate the less experienced marshals.

The tracks stood up pretty well to the pounding of constant use. Better than most expected with the exception of a few areas. This was a major worry before the start. It was still possible to pick lines and throw the car about even towards the end of the day. The slippyness may have been a helping factor as with no grip whatsoever it is difficult to dig deep holes really.

#### Conclusions

Pre event publicity and organisation by the promoting club allowed a brilliant event to be run. The disappointment of only having three competitive, unaborted runs will hopefully be addressed and next year, all the teething problems will be ironed out and the event will run super smoothly. I plan to do very few events next year but will certainly enter this one and hope that Malton Motor Club is sufficiently encouraged to do it again next year. Perhaps the introduction of a navigator or service crew member to hold the paperwork will cut down on the peg bill.


