TIM'S AUTO CHALLENGE CHAMPIONSHIP REGULATIONS AND RESULTS.

The rules of Tim's Auto Challenges are as follows:-

Open to Selby & DMC club members only

To qualify for the overall trophy you must first be registered and registrations cannot be back dated.

The first round will be on Sunday the 22nd April and will run on specified dates to be arranged later for a total of 6 rounds.

Armstrong Massey Rally Report - 8th July

As many club members will be aware, Mike Smith's regular navigator in the Mini is going to be out of action for quite a while following a nasty accident at work and as a result of this I have been asked to stand in for a while. With the car now hopefully fully sorted and with Mike's reputation as a bit of a tarmac star on the quiet, I was looking forward to this one immensely.

After successful scrutineering on Saturday, it was just a short drive on Sunday morning from Gavin's garage to get to Leconfield. It was decided to drive the car to the event to scrub in the new Yoko's in case they were needed. We were running at car 82 and were due to start stage 1 at around 9:45. This stage went without any dramas and seemed to me to be respectably quick. Back in service a quick check revealed we were only 7 secs slower than Gavin's 1.9 Gti and a little quicker than Alastair we were fairly pleased. Stage 2 was a repeat of 1 and went really well cutting 19 secs off our time to record 8 min 48. By this time SS1 times had been posted which showed us second in class behind

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Steve Petch Jr's Ka, but as his time for SS1 was fastest overall by about a minute it was obvious he had messed up a split so we were actually 1st in class but only by 8 secs from a 205 Rallye.

Stages 3 & 4 continued in the same fashion being quick but with no worrying moments - at least until the later stages of SS4. Coming through a quick 45 right and left combination brought you into a tight hairpin right. We had no trouble getting round the hairpin but the car had so much grip that it flicked up onto two wheels and for a second or two it felt in the balance whether it would come down again or go over. Mad video came over later to say he had got it on film and apparently it is one of the cover pictures that will be on everyone's video. It is also the clip they have put on their website - go to http://www.madvideo.demon.co.uk/page2.htm Unfortunately we lost the class lead on these stages to the 205. I had a wander over to see the car in the service area - a LHD ex Belgian tarmac car with all the proper bits on it.

Stages 5 & 6 saw us again just loose 3 or 4 seconds a stage to the 205 despite our best efforts. The stages were getting more open and less technical and we just lost out on top end performance. It was decided to avoid taking risks as we weren't going to catch the 205 but we had pulled over 3 minutes on 3rd in class. As Mike has never finished an Armstrong Massey and neither of us has won an award on a stage rally we would be delighted with anything in the top 3.

Stage 7 went without any real drama but Mike began to lose the clutch pedal. Having the Jack Knight box meant it wasn't really a problem though. However on Stage 8 the pedal went altogether near to the start of the stage and we decided to back off a little so as not to stress the box as Mike had been changing down into first at a fair speed to slow down for the really slow stuff but this wasn't so easy without the clutch. In any case 2nd in class was secure and the only real challenge was the 34 seconds we had in hand over Alastair for best Selby award. In the end we defended that successfully losing just 17 secs. When we got back to service it turned out to be the clutch fluid that had boiled.

The results were finalised and we were 2nd in class, 53rd overall and best Selby to boot. We were both absolutely delighted with the result but at the same time a bit sad that Guy wasn't the one alongside to share it.

Big thanks go to all the lads that helped on the day - glad that it was just spanner checking and not repairs. Thanks also to Richard Watts - it's not often the driver of an expensive GpA car finishing 5th overall is standing in the service area with a tyre pressure gauge waiting for a humble little Mini to come in. Lastly thanks to Mike for a really enjoyable day and for keeping his concentration when Lorraine Leeming's navigator started disrobing while we were queued for a stage start. Terrible the lengths some people will go to to try and distract the opposition - first time either of us had come across a Mk.1 Escort with twin airbags as standard.
