One of the delays was due to the recent confirmation of our Awards Presentation for 2002 – the date is Friday, 7<sup>th</sup> February. We have no less than three 2002 British Champions attending, it's free and open to all, not just award winners so make sure you come along. More details at the end of this scribble.

Whilst I remember, apologies to those of you who got a ropey copy of the last bulletin – the toner always seems to run out at the most awkward time, it had to go in the post that day to try and get to most of you before the 3 Swans. Hopefully you will find this one a bit more legible (if you want a fresh copy of the last one, drop me a line and I will happily send you one).

Anyway, cast your mind back through the alcoholic haze to our final round...

# ROUND 7:TBM CUTTERS / COTTINGHAM MOT CENTRE THREE SWANS RALLY, SELBY & DMC, 14<sup>TH</sup> / 15<sup>TH</sup> DECEMBER

I have to admit I was fearful that there wouldn't be enough entries for this event to run. I needn't have worried, the draw of being the final round of both our and the ANEMMC championships attracted plenty of regulars and the well publicised half night format drew out a few 'locals' to boost the entry to 28, of whom 26 started. You don't have the pleasure of a blow-by-blow account of each section, as I was not competing on the event myself, a tactical bit of marshalling would secure me the ANEMMC title and it also allowed me a bit of an insight into the event, such as seeing the route and sampling the navigation beforehand. On paper it looked a good route with interesting navigation, but I wasn't quite sure where the result was going to come from. We found out on the night, the timing was well done so everyone dropped some time and from the feedback I have had so far you all seem to have enjoyed it – the only complaint being that it was too short (but it was by design and rightly so, to ensure all controls could be marshalled) – oh, and the mud at the start – hopefully this will have gone when the event returns to its June date in 2003.

The results proved very tight, which was to be expected on a short event. Three sections proved 'uncleanable' and the other ten standard controls all had people dropping time. At petrol, Bob Marshall & Roger Hage held a comparatively big 47 second lead, but severe brake problems caused them to drop back in the second half, doing well to finish 4th. Dropping just one minute in the second half was enough for Jamie Gratton-Smith & Richard Hage to take the event win by just 14 seconds. At petrol they had been in the middle of a clutch of five cars just nine seconds apart!

However, top ANCC scorers on the night, and appropriately so, were Gavin Smith & Mike Ogram who came in second overall. A win would have been their first of the year but a very consistent set of results over eleven of the twelve rounds (with Mike marshalling on the other) means that Gav becomes champion driver for 2002 and Mike comfortably secured the second overall navigator award. Both well deserved and reward for being loyal supporters of the championship for as long as I can remember, well done, chaps.

Next up were team Dimbleby in third, another great result, I stand by what I said at the start of the year, John & David are a crew to watch and I am sure will be challenging for overall honours in our championship if they can get enough events in during 2003. As mentioned earlier Bob & Roger managed to cling onto fourth, helping Roger to third overall in the championship, his highest placing since the opening round. The major mover in the drivers' table was Andy Beaumont, he and Matt Blood came home fifth overall. His eighth score of the year enough not only to secure free registration for 2003 but also launched him into third place in the final drivers table, another man to watch for 2003 as I am sure he will be doing more events enabling him to drop scores. Team Holdsworth had one of their better results in sixth, it would have been even better had they not been held up by a taxi on one section. Nonetheless it was enough to bag them both top ten championship finishes. Likewise the two Daves, Chapman & Taylor, are top ten award winners, finishing the event eighth but only just over two and a half minutes behind the winners, showing how close it was in the end. In ninth was Danny Robinson, ahead of 2000 event winners Andy Whittaker & Charlie Tynan. Next up were top Novices David Howell & Stephen Taylor, preserving their Novice status by finishing just one second outside the top ten – some of you may remember Mr Smoley, who I mentioned in the last bulletin, going to great lengths to preserve his Novice status (including protesting himself out of the top ten on one event), I am sure he would have been proud of such

a near miss!! David does finish in the top ten of the championship though and both of them scoop Novice awards. For the second event running I have to report on below par results for two crews who have been at or near the top of the tables all year, but I am sure they will be determined to do better in 2003 rather than rueing 'what might have been' in 2002. Just five seconds fewer time penalties on this event would have meant that Sandie & Paul Taylor both finished third overall in the championship, as it is they finish fourth and fifth in their respective leagues. In thirteenth place and scuppered by a six minute wrong slot in the first half were Terry Martin & Simon Bentley. With Gav finishing well it meant that Terry's outside hope of the title was immaterial, but he can be proud of coming home second (unfortunately having also missed out on the SD34 title the week before). Simon meanwhile ended up sixth as the 'middle order' of the navigators' table proved to be very closely fought. There should be some consolation for both Simon and the Taylors as they were part of our victorious Inter Association team, so well done again for that and here's hoping you have better luck in the 2003 championship. Of our remaining contenders, Bernie Watkins & Adam Roper came home 14th, David Wilson 19th, Stan Appleton 22<sup>nd</sup> and Dave Broadley, swapping to the driver's seat and partnered at the last minute by Mike McKenna, in 23<sup>rd</sup>. For once we can present the all rounders' award and Dave deservedly wins this, having contested two events as a driver, three as a navigator and finishing all of them, as well as marshalling on numerous events. Our only nonfinisher was Craig Whitehead, who lost the battle to stay within OTL and is looking for a more experienced nav for 2003!

The results would have been very different though if I we had chosen to exclude all of you who don't appear to understand that 'quiet' means low revs and no spot lights – remember you have a responsibility as competitors to obey such signs to ensure that we can continue to enjoy ourselves on a Saturday night. Consider yourselves lucky on this occasion and take this as a warning – lights and noise are the two major sources of public complaints in our region, if you want our sport to continue, do as you are told in future. I hope I do not have to repeat this warning.

Many thanks then to Dave Coggins, Ralph Jackson, John Thornton and the rest of the Selby members (with a little help from a few other local clubs – good to see bags of Yorkshire team spirit!) for a good event that provided a worthy finale to the championship. The event seems to have been well received by all, even some of those who have previously been very critical of Yorkshire events...

So there we are, as the song goes, another year over and a new one just begun. You should find a list of 2002 award winners further on, congratulations to all those on the list. This plus the tables become final on 14<sup>th</sup> January unless I hear from any of you in the meantime. There is one award still to be sorted, that of 'Best Event', which is decided by the scores on your questionnaires. I have included one for the Beaver for those from whom I have not yet received one (as they were only dished out at petrol) plus a blank one which you can use for any event during the year (put either your name or car number on or I will ignore it, to ensure nobody tries sending lots of good or bad ones in for any one event to influence the result!). Deadline for questionnaires is also 14<sup>th</sup> January so fill them in and return them a.s.a.p., please.

The 2003 calendar plus a registration form went out with the last bulletin, please note that I only intend to send regs out to those who register for 2003, or to anyone who requests them. Due to the wonders of modern technology you will soon be able to download them from our website, at <a href="www.ancc.co.uk">www.ancc.co.uk</a>, so 'log on and check it out', as they say! The first round is once again Lincoln's Bruce Robinson Rally, this year on 15<sup>th</sup> / 16<sup>th</sup> February, regs should be with you soon. Depending on how generous I am feeling, those of you who have not yet registered for 2003 may or may not get the next bulletin, but you should still get regs for the events up to and including round 4. I hope to see many of you at our awards do, or failing that in Lincoln when you should all be itching to get back out there after two months rest!

#### INTRODUCTION

Welcome to the 'Kent Cams' 2003 Northern Road Rally Championship, which follows the successful format of past few years. There will again be 13 rounds across the length and breadth of the ANCC region, giving a wide variety of roads to test the car and driver with different types of plotting to test the navigators. The award winners at the end of the year will be those who are successful on all styles of event, not just 'specialists' in one particular area. Mindful that many new crews are put off when they come across rough roads or difficult navigation, a brief summary of each event follows this introduction so you know what to expect. In addition, individual event regulations should give an honest statement of the make up of the route (the majority of the events actually use very few 'white' roads) and examples of all types of navigation to be used on the event. Event organisers are only too happy to offer assistance to inexperienced crews before the event, after all, they want you to have a good night's sport and get to the finish, so that you will return and do their event in future vears.

For those of you who have done the championship before, there are just a few minor changes to the points scoring system, taking on board comments from the forum held last July. This year also sees the introduction of a club championship, so if you have a few mates who have been thinking about registering, now is the time to give them a push! Please feel free to pass on these regulations for inclusion in newsletters or display on notice boards. Don't hesitate to get in touch if you need some more copies We are always keen to welcome new faces to the sport or indeed those who have not competed for a while – whilst naturally very competitive, there is also a great social atmosphere at the start and finish of events, come and see for yourself. Following the supplementary regulations you should find a registration form. For just a fiver you can register in both drivers and navigators championships, you will receive regular bulletins featuring reports on events, the latest tables, details of forthcoming events, some lovely stickers to go on the car and, of course, the chance to lap up the glory at the awards do at the end of the year! If you are still not sure, then fill in the form anyway - I will add your name to the mailing list, so that for no charge you will be sent a set of regs for each round. Please feel free to contact me if you require any advice or further information. I look forward to seeing you out on events in 2003.

# A GUIDE TO THE EVENTS IN THE 2003 CHAMPIONSHIP Round One - BRUCE ROBINSON RALLY, LINCOLN MC & CC, 15/16 FEBRUARY

Our friends at Lincoln organise what is traditionally a very slick event around the surprisingly competitive (as they run them right!) lanes of North Lincolnshire. Making use of the odd white or two, this event proves popular with a great many including the historics. The navigation is relatively simple with very few pieces of trickery, therefore is another good opportunity for the novice who can have a real crack at the lanes. Starting in Lincoln the route should be around 150 miles,

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good for the standard car although the traditional finishing white may need a little care, as do the ford or two that seems to be in every year! Note that results and awards are never finalised on the morning of this event.

#### Round Two - MOORLANDS & MEADOWS RALLY, MID-DERBYSHIRE, 1/2 MARCH

This is a good introduction to Derbyshire. Clerks of Course Dave Brown & Lee Burgess have upgraded their aims in a sensible manner, and will combine stretches of terrific roads around the North & East of Derbyshire with a light foray into South & West Yorkshire. Those of the Derbyshire ilk like this one with a bit of local knowledge playing its part, but those who prefer the tarmac only plays will be just as happy. Simple navigation will be on offer and again therefore the perfect opportunity for a true novice play, there may be a clubmans permit level to encourage club members out.

#### Round Three - RYEMOOR TROPHY RALLY, MALTON MC, 22/23 MARCH

A new event to the series last year, well received by all competitors. The route on map 100 was made up of standard sections linked with regularities timed to the second, where most crews dropped time. Navigation was clear and straightforward, the roads a good mixture, any whites used cautioned where necessary. A competitive and enjoyable event for both crew members, hopefully last year's fog won't be repeated.

#### Round Four - DERBYSHIRE RALLY, MATLOCK MC, 12/13 APRIL

Our only true foray into the heart of the Peak District within this championship. The crux of the competition will be on the selection of whites and classic Derbyshire lanes used, which vary in severity, all are passable in a standard car, but if you want to post top ten times then you'll definitely need a sump guard! The organisation is in contrast always very smooth, the club has a wealth of experience and know how to make an event competitive and enjoyable. Navigation will be simple, with plenty of rejoin points and time recovery to help you get a finish. If you finish this event you should be pleased - while speed is a factor, a sensible approach in places will stop you getting lost or into difficulty. Nowhere near as rough as a few years ago, but you still need to make sure everything is bolted on securely before you start!

#### Round Five - WITCH WAY RALLY, PENDLE DMC, 10/11 MAY

A challenging event, moved from its old January date to avoid the snow, but last year got torrential rain instead! Run on some excellent lanes in East Lancs and up towards Cumbria, this is a great event for drivers with tight sections but using hardly any whites. The navigators are on the go all night too, kept very busy despite having nothing more complex than references to plot. Starts just West of Skipton.

#### Round Six - DANUM RALLY, LINDHOLME MSC, 17/18 MAY

In total contrast to the above, but just as enjoyable in a different way, this event places much more onus on the skill and accuracy of the navigator. As with almost all the events in the championship, Clerks of Course David Wilson & Ian Beech are regularly out competing so know what's what. There's a Clubmans permit event alongside so a real chance for those newcomers and twelve car entrants to try something a little more like a full rally is offered. The event is genuinely enjoyed rather than endured by those who give it a go. There is only the odd white, not too bad and not long, so the shopping car is again ideal. The event does incorporate a wide variety of plotting techniques that will give a great deal of satisfaction when you get it right. Don't let this be a put -off though, they send you examples when you enter and you can always ask for copies of previous year's nav. for practice.

#### Round Seven - THREE SWANS RALLY, SELBY & DMC, 7/8 JUNE

Another smooth event, this time in Yorkshire, starting from the club HQ. Another where the navigation may be a bit more challenging than 'the norm', the roads used will probably be fast so time penalties are usually low, but make sure you get all the codeboards written down correctly! One novelty is a finish where you can get served with a pint of ale to wash down the breakfast! This is one of the longest standing events in the series, usually enjoyable for both crew members and ideal for standard cars.

#### Round Eight - WESTMORLAND RALLY, EDEN VALLEY MC, 19/20 JULY

It may be a long way to travel up to junction 38 of the M6 for this event, but crews who have competed on it in the past will tell you it is well worth the trip. A real challenge for both crew members - plenty of testing and varied Cumbria roads, a mile or so of smooth gravel white, a quarry and the odd farmyard will keep the driver smiling, while the navigator also has to be on his toes with some great navigation and tricky junctions. Miss it and miss out.

#### Round Nine - ST WILFRID'S RALLY, RIPON MSC, 9/10 AUGUST

Another visit to a clubhouse proceeds a popular event for modern and historic alike. There'll be a moor or two to cross with some tight twisty lanes to get you there, certainly previous events have included them. The Ripon team have plenty of experience as competitors and previous organisation so it should make for a competitve and enjoyable event with its own character. Navigation should be nothing difficult, but some of the lanes up here make up for that. Unsurfaced roads will probably be used, but not many and usually smooth, Ripon learnt in the mid 90's to avoid any rough stuff. One final attraction - some really good quality trophies AND there may be cash awards on offer too.

#### Round Ten - HALL TROPHY, CLITHEROE & DMC, 6/7 SEPTEMBER

Clerk of Course Simon Daly will I am sure apply what he has learnt in the last two runnings and no doubt there will be some interesting innovations. Last year he put together an excellent route, which saw a trip through Gisburn Forest! Another event that runs a clubmans section for newcomers. If you have been put off entering from past experiences on this event, the new version is much improved (despite a few hiccups in 2002) and worth the trip.

#### Round Eleven - SEVEN DALES RALLY, DE LACY MC, 4/5 OCTOBER

This event had enhanced its reputation considerably in recent years, cracking routes and generally well set navigation. In 2000 we went for a play in the woods, Dalby and Wykeham Forests no less! Unfortunately it was cancelled in 2002, hopefully the De Lacy team will put the event back on the map in 2003. Another good event for the standard car and the novice then, (the forests don't feature every year but if used should be quite smooth), with plenty of rejoin points, but still enjoyable for the experts.

#### Round Twelve - THE COSSACK RALLY, 1/2 NOVEMBER

A very competitive event, you'll be off at "maximum attack" right from the word go. The navigation is varied but simple, with some surprisingly twisty lanes and the odd white or two, which tend to be muddy rather than rocky or rough. You won't clean some of it but you shouldn't go OTL either. The organsiers, again regular competitors, take pride in a high rate of finishers and set the event so that everyone enjoys themselves, including the marshals, who are well looked after for their work. Regarded as one of the best events in the region, it is a round of three other Championships and, just as the Westmorland is well worth a long trip for the Southern crews, so this is worth the journey for those in the North.

#### Round Thirteen - BEAVER RALLY, BEVERLEY & DMC, 6/7 DECEMBER

The East Yorkshire roads may be smooth but they often offer a wide variety of driving conditions at this time of year, it's not unusual to find ice, fog, rain or even snow. If the championship goes to the wire and is to be decided on this event, you had better get it right because mistakes that cost time or fails will really drop you down the order. The navigation usually tests East Midlands rules to the limit, Clerk of Course Graeme Potter likes to add a bit of variety to challenge the crews. Probably the biggest array of silverware all year, with named trophies galore right down to third in each class. So if your trophy cabinet is looking a bit bare at the end of the year, this could be the event for you!

N.B. Dates / events are subject to change, as much notice wil be given as possible. Further information on maps, event

format and contact names will be given in the bulletins leading up to each event.

# THE 2003 'KENT CAMS' NORTHERN ROAD RALLY CHAMPIONSHIP PROMOTED BY THE ASSOCIATION OF NORTHERN CAR CLUBS SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS

Regulations which are new, or amended for 2003, are shown in italics.

- 1. The Association of Northern Car Clubs will promote a Road Rally Championship, running between 1st January and 31st December 2003, to be known as: 'THE 'KENT CAMS' NORTHERN ROAD RALLY CHAMPIONSHIP 2003'
- 2. The Championship will be governed by the general regulations of the MSA, these supplementary regulations and any written instruction that an organising club of a championship round may issue for their event. Waiver of permit has been applied for.
- 3. The Championship shall be open to all vehicles complying with MSA technical regulations applying to road rallies, including standard production cars. N.B. The Championship organisers strongly recommend that contenders read the relevant section of the "Blue Book".
- 4. Entry to the championship will be restricted to fully paid up members of an ANCC club. In the event of a club ceasing to be a member of the Association, competitors may only count points gained from events entered under that club up to the date of that club ceasing its membership.
- 5. The Championship will consist of 13 rounds which are all National B status events. Competitors may only count their best eight scores. In the event of less than 13 rounds being run, the number of scores to count will be as follows: 11 or more rounds run 8 scores; 10 or 9 rounds 7 scores; 8 rounds 6 scores; 7 or 6 rounds 5 scores. The organisers reserve the right to amend events included and the number of events included or scores to count in the championship if necessary. Championship contenders will be informed of such changes as soon as possible.
- 6. Points may only be scored after a registration form has been accepted by the championship co-ordinator. To register, competitors must complete a championship registration form and return it to the championship co-ordinator enclosing the registration fee of £5.00. (Cheques made payable to A.N.C.C. Road Rally) *There will be no closing date for registrations*.
- 7. Points will be awarded on each round as follows:

1st registered *crew* in each class: 15 points. 2nd registered *crew* in each class: 14 points. 3rd registered *crew* in each class: 13 points.

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and so on, down to 11th registered crew in each class or below: 5 points.

Crews who start an event but fail to finish will receive 1 point.

In addition, extra points will be awarded for actual overall positions. 1st overall: 20 points, 2nd:19 points, 3rd: 18 points and so on to 20th place. The *crew's* class will be determined by the class in which he/she is listed on the final entry list.

N.B. For scoring purposes, a 'registered crew' is one in which EITHER (or both) crew member(s) is a registered contender.

- 8. Current championship positions will be published as soon as possible after each round.
- 9. There will be separate championships and awards for drivers and navigators. Competitors may enter both championships (only one fee is

payable). The best all-rounder award will be the contender with the highest aggregate score, provided that contender has competed on at least one event as a driver and one as a navigator.

- 10. To be eligible for the novice award, the competitor must not have finished in the top ten of a National B road rally prior to 1st January 2003 and not finish in the top five of a championship event during the year.
- 11. Awards will be presented as follows:

1st overall driver: ANCC Trophy and replica.
1st overall navigator: ANCC Trophy and replica.

2nd overall driver: An award. 2nd overall navigator: An award. 3rd overall driver: An award. 3rd overall navigator: An award. 4th overall driver: An award. 4th overall driver: An award. 5th overall navigator: An award. 5th overall navigator: An award.

1st novice driver: An award (Subject to three eligible contenders).

1st novice navigator: An award (" " " " ).

2nd novice driver: An award (Subject to five eligible contenders).

2nd novice navigator: An award ("""").

Best all rounder: An award.

Best event (see reg. 15): An award. Best club (see reg. 16) An award.

The Championship organisers reserve the right to add awards to the above list.

12. Competitors who marshal or officiate on any one championship event will be awarded 25 points, those who do so on a second will be awarded a further 10 points. Marshalling points will be shown highlighted on the championship table. Total marshalling points will count as one score. Competitors who are contending both driver and navigator categories may therefore score points for marshalling on four separate occasions, twice in each category. These competitors must advise the championship coordinator, within 7 days of each event, which category they wish marshalling points to be scored in and cannot change this decision at a later date. The requirement to marshal is not compulsory.

Competitors who retire from an event are encouraged to marshal where possible but will NOT be eligible for marshalling points.

- 13. Results will be finalised as soon as is practical after the last round.
- 14. Ties will be resolved in favour of the contender with the highest number of 35 point scores, then the highest number of 34 point scores and so on (including 'dropped' scores) until the tie is resolved. If the tie still exists then the championship co-ordinator will attempt to devise a fair means of resolving it!
- 15. The 'best event' will be the event with the highest average score from competitors' questionnaires. While the completion of questionnaires is not compulsory, contenders are requested to do so as they provide valuable feedback for event organisers and hopefully maintain a consistently high standard of events.
- 16. On each event, the points gained by all contenders within each ANCC club represented on that event shall be totalled, including marshalling points.

The club with the highest total shall be awarded 10 points, the next 9, and so on. All ANCC clubs represented will score a minimum of 1 point.

These individual event scores will be added up for all rounds run and an award made to the club with the highest total. A contender's points will be

credited towards the first club named on their registration form. Note also regulation 4.

- 17. A set of contenders address labels will be sent to all championship events. However, the onus is on the competitor to obtain event regulations. No preference will be given to championship contenders by event Entries Secretaries.
- 18. Contenders who score on eight or more rounds will receive free registration to the 2004 championship.
- 19. Championship Stewards are Roy Honeywell, John Richardson and Steve Smith.
